
Angela Ogden

Springhill Hospice Palliative Care Education Passport

The Springhill Palliative Care Education Passport (SPCEP) is an innovative programme providing a solid set of holistic knowledge and skills for all grades of staff. It comprises of six modules, each exploring different aspects of Palliative Care.

Modules

- Module 1- Recognising advancing disease and when someone is in the palliative phase, Advance Care Planning (ACP)
- Module 2- Communication Foundation skills for supporting people in distress
- Module 3- Psychological and spiritual needs for patients and families
- Module 4- Assessment and Care Planning for palliative needs
- Module 5- Recognising dying and care at the end of life
- Module 6- Care after death and supporting the bereaved

The Education Team is committed to making the sessions interesting and useful. By using group discussions and reflections, learners are able to develop their knowledge and skills in a safe environment. We promote person-centred care by delivering learner-centred education.



Opening the Spiritual Gate

Opening the Spiritual Gate workshop explores why spiritual care is an essential element of palliative and end of life care, how to talk about spiritual needs and how to incorporate it in to care giving.

You will:

- Develop knowledge around the emotional and physical response to bereavement
- Build the skills and confidence required to support bereaved individuals
- Recognise the need for self-care

Costs:

The aim is to teach delegates the theoretical and practical skills required to safely and effectively use syringe pumps.

The course will teach delegates the importance of ensuring the machine is set up correctly before administering any medication through them.

Course Topics

- Recognise when a syringe pump is indicated
- Drug conversions and an understanding of common drugs used
- Assessment and management of breakthrough pain
- Loading procedure of the syringe pump
- Recognise the common alerts and alarms and their meanings
- The importance of good communication skills

Enhanced Communication Skills

A 1 day course for senior health and social care professionals

This course involves working with small groups using real life scenarios to explore, support and practice communication skills in a safe space.

- Shared decision making
- Breaking bad news
- Initiating and sustaining end of life conversations
- Dealing with complaints
- Working with colleagues

Foundations of Care in a palliative care setting

The course has a strong focus on delivering care with compassion, dignity and using appropriate sensitive communication skills.

Advanced Diploma CPD Degree and Masters level (HE6 HE7) Multidisciplinary End of Life Care Module

This advanced professional development course is offered by the University of Greater Manchester in partnership with local hospice providers.

This course is ideal for health or allied health and social care professionals, involved in caring for individuals with life-limiting illnesses and end of life care. This is not limited to individuals working in the hospice setting.

We offer a systematic understanding and critical awareness of current problems and new insights in this field.

You will be supported to develop the theoretical knowledge and reflective abilities needed to deliver high-quality physical, social, spiritual and psychological care to those nearing the end of life and their loved ones.

We also focus on helping you to develop a deeper understanding of the importance of inter-professional, multidisciplinary and multi-agency working, crucial in delivering EoLC.

Skills in this complex and sensitive area of contemporary health and social care are in increasing demand.



Pates:

This programme adopts a blended learning and teaching style. Assessment is through a 20 minute presentation followed by a 20 minute viva.

- Collaborative working
- Symptom control

- Self-care/resilience
- Communication difficult conversations
- Holistic assessment
- Loss grief and bereavement
- Library skills
- Critical analysis

What is a Viva?

A Viva is an oral examination, often referred to as a thesis defence, in which a student defends their research to a panel of examiners who assess their knowledge of the subject and the quality of their work. The examiners ask questions to ensure the student truly understands their research, has become an expert in their field, and can critically analyse their own work and that of others.


